50th ANNIVERSARY OF INTERPOL

In 1914, at the invitation of Prince Albert I, several countries' Police Officers, along with magistrates and lawyers, met in Monaco to lay the foundations for international police cooperation: the meeting was the 1st International Criminal Police Congress.

In 1923, the 2nd International Criminal Police Congress met in Vienna and Johann Schober, President of the Vienna Police, revived the ideas which had inspired the Monaco meeting nine years earlier. Delegates approved plans for the creation of an "International Criminal Police Commission", with headquarters in Vienna. It worked satisfactorily until the eve of the Second World War with its activities essentially restricted to Europe.

In 1946, Mr. F.E. Louwage, then Inspector-General of the Belgian Police, invited former members of the I.C.P.C.; a five member Executive Committee was insituted and the post of an



elected Secretary General created. The headquarter moved to Paris with nineteen member countries from every part of the world. In 1956 a meeting was conducted in Vienna. A General Assembly of the fifty-five member countries' delegates decided to adopt a new constitution which would give the Organization a veritable "Charter" comparable to the instruments governing other major international organizations.


The International Criminal Police Organization, of which Ethiopia became a member 14 years back, came into being to enable countries to work together against the rising number of criminals who seek to exploit the existence of frontiers; to promote

permanent official contacts among police forces throughout the world and to exchange ideas and methods.

The purpose of I.C.P.O. - Interpol is to ensure and promote the widest possible assistance between all criminal Police authorities within the limits of the laws existing in the different countries and in the spirit of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights; and to establish and develop all institutions likely to contribute effectively to the prevention and suppression of ordinary law crimes.

Essentially, then, the purpose of the I.C.P.O. is to enable police forces in different countries to coordinate their work effectively in the double aim of law enforcement and crime prevention.

However, the Organization is strictly forbidden to undertake any intervention or activity in connection with cases which have a political, military, religious or racial character.


